Many of you will be aware that during sports day the police arrived at school asking for cars to be moved from the bus lay-by. As there are still several end of term events to come we felt it important to pass this information on.

I am reliably informed that if you park a little further away from school and walk a short distance the experience is much less stressful and safer for your children. We have again experienced a near miss this week and would not want anyone to be harmed. We are presently in consultation with NYCC to get a crossing patrol re-instated outside school which should be an improvement to the crossing situation but reduced congestion would also make a big difference
